I extend a warm welcome to new and returning staff and know that their contributions to our school will reflect our high expectations: Mr Bopf has returned from his 12 month acting principal role at Landsborough SS; Mrs Kim Holmes is our new Guidance Officer; and Mrs Kylie Bland is our new Business Manager. We are yet to recruit a new Chappy, but I will let you know when we do.

REPORT CARDS

SCHOOL COUNCIL

Before the holidays, the School Council supported a Business Breakfast with 9 local businesses who have shown an interest in working with our school. At the next Council meeting (24 July) we will discuss the feedback provided by these businesses. I asked 3 questions:

P&C SUCCESS

Part of every parent's involvement can be the participation in volunteer work within the school. Our P&C meetings are on the third Monday of each month at 6:30pm and go for about 2 hours (this month's meeting was on Monday 17 July). A significant result of the P&C recently has been the successful application to the Community Gaming Benefit Fund for \$16000 to complete the air conditioning in the Yr2 rooms, so now every classroom across the school has reverse cycle air conditioning installed. Congratulations and thanks to Mrs Lorelle Warner for writing the application for us.

You can also be involved in the tuckshop, as a classroom helper or at a P&C function (discos, carols, BBQ breakfasts etc) or by supporting raffles and stalls when they are organised. This will make our school better for your child by the P&C raising funds to help us provide even more fantastic resources for the children's learning. Thanks in advance.

This week, I ran a training session for teacher aides to support them in delivering a new literacy intervention program in the P-2 sector. This program is called '5 Minute Box'. It is a well-researched and highly successful program, which targets students with early literacy skills. It focuses on letter sounds, 2 and 3 letter words, rhyming words and sight vocabulary. It is based on several founding principles:

1. That students learn best when programs are multi-sensory – that means they are visual, auditory and kinaesthetic – students learn to hear, say, read and write the 26 single sounds and simple digraphs
2. That students working at this level need intervention little and often – 5-10 minutes, 5 days a week, is more effective than 30 minutes twice a week
3. That consistent, repetitive programs with predictable patterns and tasks allow students to feel confident and programs to be delivered efficiently and to a high standard

Class teachers and teacher aides will inform you, if your child is going to receive this intervention in school. Please feel free to come and talk to me about it if you wish. You can also find more information about the program here <http://www.fiveminutebox.co.uk/>

If you require a copy of an excursion note please go to our website www.caloundrass.eq.edu.au and click on the Support and Resources tab then Forms and Documents. Please ensure you sign and return the permission note prior to the relevant activity.

QParents and BPOINT facilities are available when paying school invoices and are our preferred method of payment. The internet web link for BPoint is: <http://www.bpoint.com.au/payments/dete>. You will need the Customer Reference Number (CRN) printed at the bottom of your invoice.

Please enter each invoice number separately. Please note we no longer can do credit card payments over the phone.

TELEPHONE CREDIT CARD PAYMENT

Unfortunately we are **no longer able to accept credit card payments over the phone**. Instead a new process is in place whereby payment is made by phoning the parent BPoint on– 1300 631 073 to pay by credit card.

You will need to have your customer reference number (CRN) and invoice number details (located on the bottom of your invoice). This process allows the department to achieve Payment Card Industry Data Security Standard (PCIDSS) compliance.

PROCESS WITH BPOINT INTERACTIVE VOICE RESPONSE (IVR)

1. Parent Calls 1300 BPOINT (1300 631073) to make a credit card payment over the phone.
2. Parent Enters their CRN, amount and card details to complete the payment.
3. At the end of the call you are provided with a unique payment receipt number and the information is sent to our OneSchool finance system (SAP/OneSchool) for automated receipting.
4. The money from the card is settled and received into the school bank account.
5. This process is PCIDSS compliant.

Please note that late payments cannot be made by BPOINT. These take at least 3 days to process and be swept from your account.

CHANGE TO OUR STUDENT ABSENCE LINE NUMBER

Our absence contact text only number is 0418 159 088. Please note this number is for text messages only and is unable to receive voice calls. Eventually the current student absence line will be deactivated.

You can also register for QParents as per your email invitation to enter student absence details.

NB: There is no need to text/call us if you have entered the absence on QParents.

For a number of students this is their first opportunity to experience team sport in a competitive environment and they will certainly enjoy the experience. Often students will go on to join local club teams to further develop their skills and sporting involvement. Organised sport develops many skills and attributes that are transferable to all aspects of life. I hope you enjoy the experience this year.

ATHLETICS

In the last week of the Term 2 the four sports Houses competed in the school athletics carnival with Kings taking out the prize of champion House. All students are to be commended for their individual efforts and the spirit in which they competed. The teachers won the student/parent/teacher relay in a world record time. Two elderly male members of the parent team had to receive extended medical assistance after the event and have officially announced their retirement from competitive sport.

A team of 36 students, aged 10, 11 and 12 years of age, have been selected to go on and represent the school at the Coastal Districts Athletics Trials at the University of the Sunshine Coast on the 1st and 3rd of August. All of these students placed 1st and 2nd in their respective events at the school carnival and will train at lunch times and Friday mornings to prepare for the challenge ahead. There is an opportunity now for these students to continue on to the Pacific School Games (PSG) in Adelaide in early December. Over 3000 competitors from Pacific Rim countries and individual schools from Japan, USA, Canada and South Africa participate at this event. It is an amazing event so why not be a part of it.

MY CHILD IS FALLING BEHIND AT SCHOOL – WHAT SHOULD I DO?

GET INVOLVED

Find out which areas your child is struggling in, or where they need improvement and get involved. If it’s maths, get them to discuss their maths homework with you and solve problems together. Be the guiding eye and encourage them to keep practicing even when they feel it is too hard.

GET THEM ORGANIZED

Doing up a homework schedule may work well for your child. If they thrive on routine and patterns, doing up a timetable for them to study could be the organization they need. Spending X-hours on a certain subject each week will ensure they don’t skip over anything.

EMPHASISE SUCCESSES

When your child has small wins, shout it out. Positive reinforcement helps build a positive relationship between your child and that subject. Once they know they can do it, they’ll be more determined to do well.

TALK TO THE TEACHER

If your child is falling behind at school, it is worth talking to their teacher to find out what is happening in the classroom. Maybe they’re getting bullied or are easily distracted and need to channel their focus more on school work. This could be the source of the issue.

TEACH THEM MEMORY GAMES

Some children won’t take to this, but some will absolutely thrive on it – especially creative ones. Use flash cards and quirky sayings, acronyms or songs to help your child remember certain phrases or formulas.
